WITH RABBI KALISCH: A GOD WHO DOESN'T WANT OUR LIES Together, we will share the lituray of the holiday of Shavuot, as we celebrate receiving Torah. This year, we are delighted to be celebrating the Confirmation of 6 high school students, who will affirm their personal accepting of Torah through the ceremony of Confirmation.

Our tradition calls God a God of Truth, but as human beings, we struggle with honesty. What does Shavuot teach us about the Jewish perspective on truth, and How can we have a relationship with God and with Torah that is based in intellectual honesty? low to navigate
